Dr. Alexandroff leads the Global Institutional Reform (GIR) Workshop designed to evaluate the adequacy of institutional reform proposals for the international system. Following the editing of, *Can the World be Governed? Possibilities for Effective Multilateralism* (Wilfrid Laurier University Press, 2008), a second volume co-edited with Andrew F. Cooper has been published recently, *Rising States; Rising Institutions: Challenges for Global Governance* (Brookings Institution Press, 2010).
